CSRG's 11th Annual Charity Challenge, October 3-5 at Sonoma Raceway

Entries: Hopefully you and your mechanic have been working at a feverish pace to prepare your car for CSRG's showcase event, The 11th Annual Charity Challenge. As you all know, this is our big event and we expect a lot of cars---perhaps more cars than ever before. The point is: Don't get left out. Motel Accommodations:

I've found that some of the usual motels, Marriott and Best Western have already run out of rooms. I'm sure that they will suddenly find some additional rooms as the race weekend approaches, but be forewarned, space will be at a premium.

Paddock Space:

With the number of spectators we've been getting at the last two Sonoma events, and the number of tickets to the Charity Challenge that have already been sold, we expect a lot of spectators. Our aim is to give them a good

show, from paddock presentation to the race track.

Obviously spectators come to see your exotic historic and vintage race car, but they have minimal interest in your transporter, trailer, motor home, tow vehicle, or your street car. So, this year, we have designated the area across from the garages (marked in yellow, below) as a "race car only" area. **Essential** support vehicles may be parked behind the race cars. We're trying to avoid the appearance of compounds that make people reluctant to enter and look at the race cars. We want to make the paddock really spectator friendly and ask for your help in achieving this aim.



Formula 1:

As previously mentioned, we will have Masters-HGP joining us at the Charity Challenge with 23 of their Formula 1 cars being entered, which should make for a great show. Additionally, we will have our F1 regulars like Chris Locke, Dr. Nick Colyvas & others. Even occasional F1 competitor, John Anderson, might have a surprise up his sleeve.

Associate Member Benefits: At its July meeting, the CSRG Board of

Directors agreed to the suggestion that currently registered Associate Members should receive two-complimentary gate tickets for CSRG race events (face value \$160 a year) and should have the opportunity to purchase additional tickets at the Guest of Entrant price, which is currently \$10. FYI, the difference between an Associate Membership and a full Racing Membership is that an Associate Member can't enter a race, can't get a CSRG Medical Card (Vintage racing license) and can't vote for Directors or bylaws changes.

SVRA Adds Sonoma & Portland Historics

This is old news but I mention it for those few who have not heard. SVRA will be bringing a new type of vintage racing to California, for it is now the organizing body for what were previously General Racing's Sonoma Historics and HMSA's Portland Historic Races. It will be interesting to see what happens, but I think the CSRG race dates are far enough apart from Sonoma and Portland to avoid conflict. Moreover, the CSRG approach to vintage cars and racing is fundementally different than SVRA's. Ultimately the success of our races, particularly the May Thunderhill race will depend upon the members. As I've said many times; Use it or lose it.

Sedan Racers & Newer Production Cars:

As a reminder to all: Our races are open to all of the traditional CSRG racing classes which include Production, GT, Sports Racer, Formula, and SCCA Sedans. Information regarding these classes may be found within the Rules & Safety Handbook under "Classification" in Section III, Paragraph B here: Rules & Safety

Note that last year CSRG created a Group 8 Production SCCA A, B, (Trans-Am owners pay attention) and C Sedan built to 1968 through 1972 SCCA Rules. Also welcome in that group are special sedans and compatible production sports cars. If you know of somebody who has a car, but hasn't raced with CSRG for whatever reason, I would ask you

to be an advocate for the club and encourage the individual to join.

Memberships:

Make sure you've renewed your membership for this season. Current members get preferential treatment if there is a car number conflict in a run group,

as do people who enter early. To see if you already renewed, look at the membership expiration date in your Profile at csrg.motorsportreg.com. Membership Renewals: If you can't remember whether you renewed for this season, you can check your Profile at CSRG MotorsportsReg or ask the Race Director.

Tech inspection sheets:

You can get a head start on your Tech Inspection tasks by downloading the Pre-Tech Inspection Forms. These forms are not meant to replace the sheets you will receive by e-mail with your information packet but are provided as information and as a work sheet so you may inspect and gather all the data necessary to complete the official form. Click Pre-TechWorksheet to print your copy of the worksheet.

Entrant Packets:

All race entrant packets for CSRG events, including Tech Forms and gate tickets, will be held at Will Call outside the track security/ticket gate or at Registration. We are no longer mailing them to entrants. The packets are held in the name of the Entrant. We advise you to print a copy of the Pre-Tech Worksheet to make sure you have completed all the inspections and have all the information needed to complete the Tech Forms when you arrive at the track.

Download Medical Forms:

Click on <u>CSRGmedform13.pdf</u> to download a copy of the form. You do not need to send in the original Medical Form with the "wet" signature to CSRG. You can now keep your original and either mail a clear photocopy or, better yet, scan the complete four page form and email it to:

It would be wise to file the original until its medical certification period expires. The scan and email system is the preferred method, otherwise mail the forms to CSRG at P.O. Box 3223, San Rafael Ca. 94912.
